The Carmichael Elks Golf Club members met at the Lodge on Thursday, April 3rd to discuss club business and upcoming events. **President Bill Bethell** started the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and welcomed all in attendance. Handicap Chair John Simmons led members in a **Moment of Silence for Jim Toner**, who passed away on March 9th. Jim Toner was a fellow member and player who loved the sport and contributed to our Club in so many ways. Jim our old friend, will be sadly missed by all who knew him.

Our last two tournaments, Ancil Hoffman and Mather Golf Course being canceled due to rain, our agenda was short and the meeting quickly moved on. Treasurer Jerry Trautman gave the monthly report on the treasury status and noted that all is in order and no outstanding cost are pending. Tournament Chair Georgia Lipphardt announced that upcoming April Tournaments are scheduled for Wildhawk on 4/14/25, Bartley Cavanaugh on 4/21/25 and MacKenzie on 4/28/25. Signups were taken for all three tournaments. The results of those tournaments will be announced in the next month's Newsletter. Wildhawk has asked that players join in their goal to complete an 18 hole round in 4.5 hours. Wildhawk has set four clocks spaced out on the course. When reaching a clock, if they find the clock time is after the groups' start time, they are behind and must catch up. Playing a forward tee or combo option may also help keep the pace. The rescheduling of the two rained out tournaments are Ancil Hoffman, set for Tuesday, October 7th, and Mather Golf rescheduled for August 11, 2025. We have set the August time for an early 6:30 am, which caused a few moans from those in attendance. The early time should make our morning commute easier and also gets us up and out from the course, before the serious heat of the day. A new tournament schedule will be sent out in the coming weeks. VC Lipphardt also noted that Empire has given us only 24 slots for our proposed Scramble to be played at Empire on November 3th. They may allow an increase in the number of players, but a request must be made 10 days in advance of the November 3th tournament day. Handicap Chair John Simmons reminded players that Wildhawk and MacKenzie are both Championship Tournaments of the eight total Championship tournaments played.
